In June, 2016 the Board began to revisit the question of a physical education facility for Lake City Community School. After two community meetings in July, the board redirected the effort with a broader scope to develop a plan for all facilities with a 10-year outlook.

The process underway includes data gathering, needs analysis, options development, and selection. The data gathering included history and projections of enrollment and population. A comparative peer survey was developed reaching out to 41 school districts, most with enrollment of 200 students or less. Twenty-two responded with data on their facility size, use, and recent projects. More details are posted on the website at www.lakecityschool.org/facilities-planning.
